Our Vision and Mission

Young Adult Communities Facing Health Inequities

Black/African-American

- ❖ Those under the age of 35 are diagnosed with breast cancer at two times the rate of White women, and they are 42% more likely to die of metastatic breast cancer.
- Only about half (54%) of breast cancers in Black women are diagnosed at a local stage, compared to 64% in White women.

- * There is great diversity amongst the LGBTQ+ community; each population has its own unique set of cancer disparities and health risks.
- Recent data suggests that LGBTQ+ are diagnosed with breast cancer at significantly younger ages.





Asian/Pacific Islander

- API young women have lower incidence than other ethnic groups, although incidence rates vary among ethnic groups.
- Native Hawaiian, Japanese, Samoan and Filipina women are more likely to develop breast cancer at earlier ages (under 45) and later stages.

- Latinx are often diagnosed at earlier ages (under 45) with larger, more advanced staged tumors that are often hormone receptor negative.
- Latinx are 3X less likely than white women to have a consistent source of quality medical care.


